#### Vaccine Sticker Reminder

Torrance Memorial staff, physicians and volunteers who have received the COVID-19 vaccine will receive a permanent badge sticker (yellow daisy). Directors and managers are responsible for distributing stickers. If you have questions, please contact your manager or call Employee Health Services.

#### Expedited Entrance Screening:

Starting July 1, staff, physicians, volunteers with a COVID-19 vaccination sticker will be allowed to expedite the entrance screening process, no longer needing a daily sticker (required to show badge to screener). Those who have yet to become vaccinated, will still need to follow the current screening process and apply the daily screening sticker to your badge.

- Place sticker on the upper right corner of the badge, not on the plastic cover (sticker should not interfere with name or photo)
- Remove any remaining daily screening stickers and "I got my COVID-19 vaccine" stickers from badge

#### Vaccine Clinics for Staff, Physicians and Volunteers

- Weekly vaccination clinics available outside TCU
  - Every Thursday from 0930 to 1600
- To register for Thursday COVID-19 Clinics email <a href="mailto:lntCovVaxClinic@tmmc.com">lntCovVaxClinic@tmmc.com</a> and provide your name and phone number. You will be sent an email to schedule your vaccination appointment.
- Option to schedule your second dose appointment in MyTurn at the same location.
- After your second dose, you will receive the COVID-19 vaccination verification sticker to be applied to your badge.

If you are unable to attend a Thursday vaccination clinic, we encourage you to find an alternate vaccination site. #### Visitor Guideline Reminders:

Surgical Services - One visitor will be allowed to accompany an adult or pediatric surgical patient.

- Due to seating capacity restrictions in waiting areas, visitors will need to leave the hospital during the
  patient's procedure. A member of the care team will notify the visitor of surgical updates and when the
  patient is ready for discharge.
- The only exceptions are for pediatric patients and/or special needs patients. One parent or guardian will be allowed in the surgical waiting room or main lobby and into the recovery area. Visitor must be the same individual for the entire day.

#### **Outpatient Areas:**

- Emergency Department One visitor allowed per patient at a time, if social distancing permits, unless
  patient is exhibiting respiratory or COVID-19 symptoms. Visitors and/or caregivers not accompanying a
  patient will be asked for contact information. Clinical staff will assess caregiver need if patient is under
  the age of 18 or if the patient requires special assistance.
- Hunt Cancer Center Only patients with physician or nurse practitioner appointments are allowed one visitor. No visitors will be allowed for patients with infusion/treatment appointments, lab appointments or injection appointments unless patient requires special assistance.
- All Other Outpatient Areas No visitors will be allowed unless patient is under the age of 18 or the
  patient requires special assistance in the following areas:
  - Radiation Oncology
  - Radiology and Imaging
  - Laboratory and Blood Draw
  - Rehabilitation, Infusion and Ambulatory Care
  - Endoscopy, Gl Lab, and Nuclear Medicine

#### Lost Your COVID-19 Vaccination Card?

If you are unable to locate your vaccination card, you can request a new one from CDPH

#### Instructions:

- Go to <a href="https://mvvaccinerecord.cdph.ca.gov/">https://mvvaccinerecord.cdph.ca.gov/</a>
- Enter your first/last name and birthdate
- 3. Select the preferred channel to receive vaccination verification: text or email
- Create PIN
- 5. You will receive a text or email immediately
- 6. Enter PIN and press submit to receive your vaccination verification

If you were vaccinated at a Torrance Memorial COVID-19 vaccination clinic, you can also go to EHS to receive a replacement card.

Re: UPDATE: Pre-Procedural COVID-19 Screening Testing Changes for Vaccinated Patients

#### What to Know:

Starting June 22, 2021 Torrance Memorial will no longer require <u>vaccinated</u>, <u>asymptomatic</u> patients get tested for COVID-19 prior to a procedure requiring moderate sedation, anesthesia or an aerosol generating procedures.

Staggered Implementation of New Guidelines:

- June 22: Cath Lab, Endoscopy Center, Sleep/Pulmonary
- June 29: Inpatient/Outpatient Surgery and Imaging

Due to the reduction of pre-procedural COVID testing, Torrance Memorial's drive through testing site will reduce its hours of operation beginning July 5. Monday – Friday 8:15am to 12:15pm

#### Definition: Fully Vaccinated

≥ 2 weeks following receipt of the second dose in a 2-dose series

#### OR

≥ 2 weeks following receipt of one dose of a single-dose vaccine

#### What to Do

Scheduling physician must verify patient's vaccination status with one of the following:

- · Verify vaccination status (must have completed the vaccination series)
- Must present one of the following proof of vaccinations:
  - Vaccination card
  - o Photo of the vaccination card
  - o Digital record (i.e. Healthvana)

Surgeon/proceduralists will include patient vaccination status when scheduling surgery or procedure. If unvaccinated, physician will follow existing procedure and order COVID-19 test.

Notify patients to bring proof of vaccination with them the day of surgery/procedure.

#### What to Know:

Effective June 22, 2021 Torrance Memorial will no longer require COVID testing for <u>vaccinated</u>, <u>asymptomatic</u> patients admitted to through the Emergency Department.

#### **Definition: Fully Vaccinated**

- ≥ 2 weeks following receipt of the second dose in a 2-dose series, OR
- ≥ 2 weeks following receipt of one dose of a single-dose vaccine

#### What to Do:

During patient intake verify patient's vaccination status with one of the following:

- · Verify vaccination status (must have completed the vaccination series)
- · Must present one of the following proof of vaccinations:
  - Vaccination card
  - o Photo of the vaccination card
  - o Digital record (i.e. Healthvana)

## **Electronic Prescribing Tips and Tricks**

Hello all,

As your Executive Director of Medical Informatics, I am your physician liaison to all things Cerner Millennium. With an experienced team of informaticists and service specialists supporting me, we are available to assist you with questions or ideas regarding use of the electronic medical record across both the acute and ambulatory locations of the Torrance Memorial Health System.

Today, we are talking about all sorts of things related to Electronic Prescribing, or "ePrescribing." ePrescribing is here and very soon will be required. There are many advantages to ePrescribing, including the ability to prescribe off campus and the inability for prescriptions to be forged, altered or stolen. Here are some vital tips for using ePrescribe within Cerner Millennium.

#### **Eprescribing**

Per AB 2789, beginning January 1, 2022, all prescriptions must be submitted electronically, with a few exceptions. Here is the link to the bill:



Prior to this date, be sure and go to Medical Staff Office to sign up for ePrescribing at TMMC. You will receive instruction on how to electronically prescribe using PowerChart. You will also receive instruction and authorization on how to install the Google Authenticator App on your personal phone. This is the two-factor identification system that will allow you to prescribe controlled substance via PowerChart. If you need additional training, please contact me and we can set up a visit to the Informatics department or I can meet you in your office or the hospital to help you get started.

#### **Opioid Review**

On the Acute Provider View Page within PowerChart, you will see a section called Opioid Review. Opening the This provides the same information as CURES and documents that you have reviewed the patient's controlled substance record. No need to go to an outside website.


From your *Provider View Page*, find *Opioid Review* and click *View Report*. This may version may look slightly different than your view but will function the same.



## **Electronic Prescribing Tips and Tricks**

#### **External Rx History**

External Rx History gives you the ability to review pharmacy records on your patient. This function does require the pharmacy to report it into our system, but all major pharmacies participate. You can see whether or not the patient is filling their medications, additional prescribers, identify a medication prescribed in an emergency department or urgent care, and get an idea of a new patient's history. This section has two options, View, to see the list, and Import, to bring the list in to the system. Currently we are recommending against Import as the medication details have not been verified yet. You can locate the link to External Rx History on either the Orders page or the Medication List page. Click the down arrow on the button and choose "View."



#### Cancel/Reorder Rx

Occasionally, after you complete Med Rec and send off that prescription, the nurse will come to you and say the patient requested a different pharmacy or the pharmacy calls and said they didn't get the prescription, and can you send again? You do not have to complete Med Rec again, it can be done quickly from the Orders screen using the Cancel/Reorder function. I've attached a short PowerPoint explaining how to do it. It takes only a few seconds!



## **Electronic Prescribing Tips and Tricks**

#### **Real Time Prescription Benefits**

Real Time Prescription Benefits is a new function on the Med Reconciliation screen at discharge that gives you information on cost comparisons and savings for your patient while you are prescribing. It will allow you to quickly change to a different medication that may be beneficial for your patient. Check out the Power-Point here if you want to see how it works!

What started as a superficial scratch 51year-old Oscar Gallardo made on his left toe last June while swimming in a pool turned out to be so much more. After several days of self-care, he noticed discoloration at the scratch site had spread throughout his forefoot. Having underlying diabetes since childhood, he became concerned and made an appointment to see his physician. He was told not to worry, was treated with creams and told not to wear shoes to give his foot a chance to heal. After nearly five months of treatment, an infection developed. He feared he would lose his entire foot. At this point, he sought help at Torrance Memorial's Burn, Wound Healing and Amputation Prevention Center - where he found life and limb-saving care. "From the moment I met Dr. Karen Shum, I told her I would do anything to save my foot," said Gallardo.

Dr. Shum quickly diagnosed a vascular blockage previously missed, which prevented his healing. A vascular procedure was done to clear the vessel blockage. Dr. Shum told him a transmetatarsal amputation to remove the infected toes, was necessary. She would try to preserve as much of his foot as possible to enable ambulation with a functional limb. From proper diagnosis and problem-solving to surgery, Gallardo found the care at Torrance Memorial to be very good and personal. "I found the confidence I needed and received life-saving care," said Gallardo. The team at Torrance Memorial gave him the reassurance that he was finally getting the right care. Dr. Shum even arranged for state-of-the-art hyperbaric oxygen therapy to prevent further infection and promote healing. Gallardo is now making a full recovery.

He was also inspired to make personal lifestyle changes by exercising routinely and improving his diet. Today, he has lost nearly 65 lbs. and feels like he has his life back – not to mention the preservation of his left foot. Gallardo has been able to return to work and credits the team at Torrance Memorial Wound Healing and Amputation Prevention Center for saving his foot and enabling him to walk again.
