Surgical consultation	You will meet with a surgeon to discuss surgical options. The surgeon's office will schedule your surgery and give you instructions about what needs to be done prior to your surgery and other pertinent information regarding the day of your surgery. Medical oncology consultation	You will meet with a medical oncologist either before or after surgery to discuss additional treatment(s) that might be needed such as chemotherapy, radiation and anti-hormonal therapy.
